The current network will transition 'as is', so there will be no significant changes to routes or timetables on day one.


18 September 2023: launch the new Bee Network app and website, alongside changes to the TfGM and Metrolink social media accounts

2023 Tranche 1 Wigan **24 September 2023** – tranche one will go live, covering Bolton, Wigan, and parts of Salford and Bury.









TfGM & Network Rail partnership

Partnership, announced in August, will focus on transport upgrades and supporting regeneration that allow Manchester and Salford to support the regional economy.



Cycle Hire

Greater Manchester's Cycle Hire scheme will see bike availability boosted by a range of new measures:

- Prioritising cycle hire stations in areas of highest usage
- Tackling the repair backlog and redistributing bikes.
- Increased fines for users who do not comply with rules.
- Beryl joining the TravelSafe Partnership (TSP). Cycle hire staff are now deployed to TfGM's control room.
- Further operations with GM Police's dedicated Transport Unit.



Where we're at:

- Met 500+ target available bikes last week.
- Anti-Social Behaviour / vandalism on the bikes is still relatively high, but has stabilised and is currently manageable.
- We have a good collaboration with GMP and a number of arrests have been made with people in possession of stolen bikes.
- Usage is still very good, and we are getting 1215 rides per day so far this month.

Greater Manchester Clean Air Plan

- GM's ten local authorities remain under a legal direction to comply with legal nitrogen dioxide (NO₂) limits in the shortest time possible and by 2026 at the latest.
- therefore we want to align our own work with the outcome of the government review.
- All of the above will impact the timing of any future public consultation. \bullet
- Next formal update is expected at the end of October. \bullet

• GM was due to submit further evidence to support a non-charging zone in June 2023. However, part of the modelling included the emissions benefits of a bus retrofit programme. This approach is now been under review by government due to the technology delivering 'variable' results in reducing emissions.

The penalty fare for travelling without a valid ticket or pass on Metrolink will be increasing to £120 from the 24^{th} September as part of ongoing efforts to tackle fare evasion on public transport. 30 new TravelSafe Support and Enforcement Officers (TSEOs) will be patrolling franchised bus services, interchanges and bus stations from 24 September.




