Many people who are asylum seekers or refugees do not receive any support from the UK government and do not have access to housing or benefits. The Boaz Trust provides accommodation and specialist support and works towards ending destitution among people seeking sanctuary.

The Migrant Destitution Fund supports destitute migrants who have "no recourse to public funds" - a policy which leaves people unable to meet their basic needs, not supported by the state and not allowed to do paid work to support themselves. Many applications are made on behalf of asylum seekers who have been refused by the Home Office, many of whom eventually secure their right to remain. Local charities identify someone who needs support and make an application to the Fund.



Donation: £20.00 to support a destitute migrant

The MDF was first piloted in 2018 and it was clear there is a great need for it. It reopened in April 2020 and has given out over 350 grants since. However funds are now running very low, with only one month's left worth of money left, and an increasing demand for it.
