Information for BID levy payers, residents and businesses

As we welcome people back into the city as Manchester comes out of lockdown, Manchester Business Improvement District (Manchester BID) and CityCo with partners Manchester City Council and Visit Manchester are hosting the first public event in the city centre since January 2020 ahead of programme of events this Summer including Manchester International Festival and Manchester Pride. The Manchester Flower Show is a bright, blooming, floral celebration that will make Manchester look at it's very best with a trail of floral displays across the city for 9 days, with many businesses and organisations coming together to create green interventions, blooming windows, balconies, bus stops and more from King Street to Ancoats, First Street to the Cathedral and everywhere in between with activity in the retail core of the city centre created by Manchester BID focusing on King Street, New Cathedral Street, Exchange Square and St Ann's Square.

This event is all about businesses and communities coming together to create something beautiful for the city and they have come out in force to create what we hope to be a really special event.

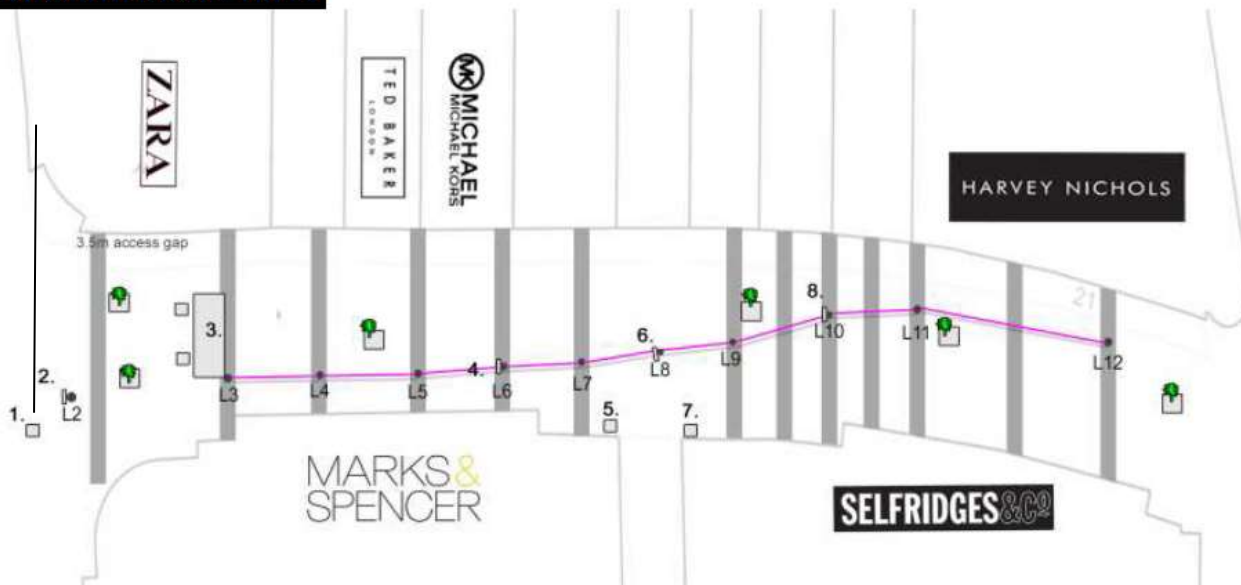
