

Dear Resident / Business occupier,

This year's Great Manchester Run will take place on Sunday 26th September 2021 and includes the 10k, Junior, Mini, and Half Marathon events. If you're not taking part or can't get out to see the action live, the event will be broadcast live on BBC 2 from 11:00 – 13:00 (please check TV listings for up-to-date timings).

A stellar elite line-up will feature some of the world's best athletes, who will head a field of more than 15,000 competitors. The action-packed day starts with the Great Manchester Run Half Marathon at 08:30, followed by the Elite 10k Wheelchair race at 09:00. The young runners get their chance to shine with the Junior and Mini Run's starting at 09:30, before the elite women 10k race starts at 11:15. The elite men start with the first of the 10k massed starts 11:30, with two more massed starts at 12:00 and 12:30.

Several roads within the city will be affected by the events and road closures and traffic diversion plans will be in operation on the day. We'll be installing warning notices seven days before the event. A copy of the full closures are listed below:

The following road will be closed from **06:00**: **Mancunian Way (East and West bound)** from Fairfield St to Regent Rd and **Pinmill Brow** from Fairfield Street to Mancunian Way.


ROAD RE-OPENING TIMES

Sunday 26th September 2021

11:30: Ashton New Rd; Alan Turning Way; 13:00: Ashton Old Rd; Chorlton Rd; Fairfield St; Manor St; Midland St; Pin Mill St; Mancunian Way; 14:45: Albion St; City Rd East; Great Jackson St; Medlock St and Whitworth St; 16:00: Peter St; Portland St; Abingdon St; Bloom St; Chepstow St; Chrolton St; Cross St; Great Bridgewater St; Major St; Minshul St; Oxford St; Portland St; Princes Street; Sackville St; Silver St 18:00: all remaining on course roads; 19:00: Deansgate from Whitworth St West to Peter St; 21:00: St John St; 23:00: Tonman St.

Residents living directly on, or with secured parking off, any of the above roads who will need to use their car on **Sunday 26th September 2021** should use alternative parking away from the roads affected by the road closures.

Event stewards will assist traffic and residents wherever possible on the day of the race, allowing access to and from properties within the road closures whenever it is safe to do so up until **08:00**. Please note that for safety reasons there can be no access onto the course after this time. We will endeavour to open roads as soon as possible.



On street parking suspensions will be in operation within the city centre for the duration of the events, most of which start at 04:00 on Sunday 26th September 2021. These suspensions will be signed clearly in accordance with Manchester City Council protocol. Please do not park your car in any of the parking bays during the period of suspension, as it will be removed for safety purposes by Manchester City Council Parking Control, in accordance with their current uplift policy. There may be a charge to recover an impounded vehicle.
