



Network trends: the long-term GM picture





During the 28-day period ending 21 November across GM compared to equivalent period in 2019






Total trips 3% below


During the last seven days (w/e 21 November) across GM compared to equivalent week in 2019



Total trips 2.5% below





Regional centre weekly snapshot

- During the week ending 21 November the Regional Centre saw an estimated 3.9 million trips
- This is 5% up on the previous week with 2.8 million trips from GM and 1.2 million from outside of GM
- Saturday 20 November saw the highest number of trips to the Regional Centre last week – equivalent to the same level compared to 2019
- Significantly more trips at weekends than during weekdays – hospitality and leisure trips back up to prepandemic
- Including key retail period of Saturday and Sunday between 09:30 and 16:00 – 2% above 2019 equivalent







The journey to delivering an integrated transport network for GM





The vision for Bee Network





GM's vision for an integrated 'London-style' transport system which will join together buses, trams, cycling and walking by 2024, with commuter rail incorporated by 2030, to transform how people travel.

An accessible, affordable and easy-to-use network, with a daily fare cap and single multi-modal ticket, which will support seamless end-to-end journeys within GM, irrespective of the destination.

Designing and delivering public transport as one system with local control and accountability.

Playing a key role in Greater Manchester's plans to be net zero by 2038.

Mitigating the impact of traffic congestion – which had an estimated annual cost to GM business of £1.3bn prepandemic.

Bee Network Cycle Hire underway in Manchester and Salford




- First phase of GM's 24/7 cycle hire scheme launched last week
- Hire bikes now available from multiple stations along Oxford Road and at the University of Salford
- Supporting commuters, students and cross city travellers
- More than 1.2k rides during the 5 days following launch
- More stations and bikes rolling out over the coming weeks and months
- Phase one (including expansion into Trafford)
 expected be fully up and running by June 2022 –
 with total of 1,500 bikes including 300 e-bikes available to the public

Investment in key transport infrastructure




- Confirmation through the Comprehensive Spending Review of £1.07bn in infrastructure funding for GM
- Will deliver significant investment in transport facilities – integral to the infrastructure required to create the Bee Network
- Creating vital new connections between towns, high streets and communities, fast orbital bus routes, new and improved stations and highquality cycling and walking routes
- Supporting delivery of GM's transport pipeline, as laid out in Our Five Year Transport Delivery Plan 2021-2026
- Final submission against allocation in development



Delivering a London-style bus network





Seeking to secure further funding through the Bus Service Improvement Plan, submitted last month

Will deliver the fares and services, alongside the infrastructure, to transform the whole journey experience – aligned to the National Bus Strategy

GM in a unique position to deliver on this vision following Mayoral decision to proceed with bus franchising

Including more affordable journeys, with London-style £1.55 'hopper' fares, travelcards, daily and weekly capping for all bus travel, and for trips interchanging between modes


Underpinned by plans for:

- Stabilising and strengthening services and routes
- Investment in bus priority measures, passenger facilities and real-time customer information
- A full fleet of zero emission, high quality buses and associated support infrastructure, to be in place by 2032

Integrated Rail Plan (IRP)



- Sets out a blueprint for the development of the strategic rail network over the next 30 years
- Confirmed that Phase 2B: Crewe to Manchester, with high-speed rail stations at Manchester Airport and Piccadilly, will be delivered as part of HS2
- However, timescales for delivery remain uncertain
- On Northern Powerhouse Rail, a significantly different plan to the original one proposed by Transport for the North has been set out

What is the Clean Air Plan?


Air pollution is linked to a range of very serious health conditions and contributes to early deaths. Greater Manchester (GM) is taking action to improve air quality on local roads – now and for future generations.

All ten GM local authorities have worked together to develop a joint Clean Air Plan (CAP) for Greater Manchester. This has now been agreed. It includes:

- A category C charging GM-wide Clean Air Zone, which is required as directed by government to secure compliance with nitrogen dioxide (NO₂) legal limits on local roads in the shortest possible time, and by 2024 at the latest.
- Over £120m support through grants and finance options for GM businesses, people and organisations to upgrade eligible non-compliant vehicles



GM Clean Air Plan milestones and look ahead



Work continues with JAQU, National Highways and Tameside MBC around the inclusion of the A628 / A57 in the GM CAZ

* Coaches will be able to apply for a temporary exemption from January 2022 until 1st June 2023.





Support and advice for those affected



- Government Vehicle Compliance Checker now available cleanairgm.com/prepare
- Those affected will be able to check to see if:
 - Their vehicle is non-compliant
 - They are eligible for a permanent exemption
 - They are eligible for a temporary exemption, and whether they need to apply*
 - They are eligible for a discount and how to apply*
 - They are eligible for funding and the options for financial support.
- Support will be available via online and non-digital channels
- Provision of wraparound advice through the Growth Company in development
- Online financial support application portal live from end of November for HGV
- * Applications for discount and exemptions available from end January 2022



Prepare for clean air

- The national vehicle checker is now live and uses DVLA data to check whether vehicles are impacted based on numberplate
- Use the online vehicle checker to check if you're impacted, and what support and funding is available: <u>cleanairgm.com/prepare</u>
- Sign up for Clean Air updates: cleanairgm.com
- Applications for funding opens for HGVs on 30th November
- Applications for funding for other eligible vehicles opens at the end of January 2022
